If-sentence + Present Tense, will + Grundform

Kein "will" im if-Satz!!!

Examples: If you **break** a mirror, you **will have** (= you'll have) bad luck.

If we **don't hurry**, we **won't catch** (= will not catch) the train.

If Jack **comes** to the party, I **won't come**.
